




Committees of Correspondence came about as a result of the Sugar Act.

British troops were then stationed in Boston.









Although the British soldiers were toung not guilty of murger, this event angered many colonists. Tensions had been growing since the British troops were placed in the city.



Intolerable Acts:

- 1) shut down the port of Boston until colonist paid for tea
- 2) town meetings were limited, as were legislative sessions (limited their self- government)
- 3) English officials charged with crimes would be tried in England

(basically assured there would not be a "fair trial")

4) Quartering Act

Colonists had to house British troops in their homes!

Led to the 1st Continental Congress. Sent King George Declaration of Rights. He refused this!
