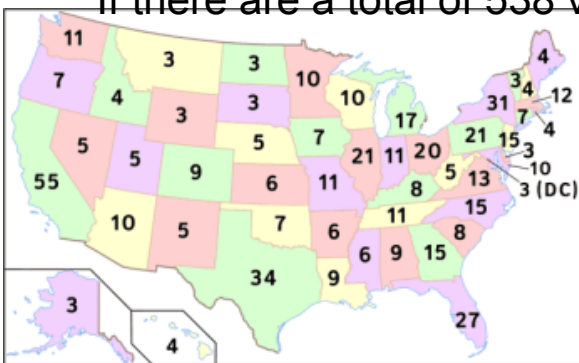

Order of presidential succession

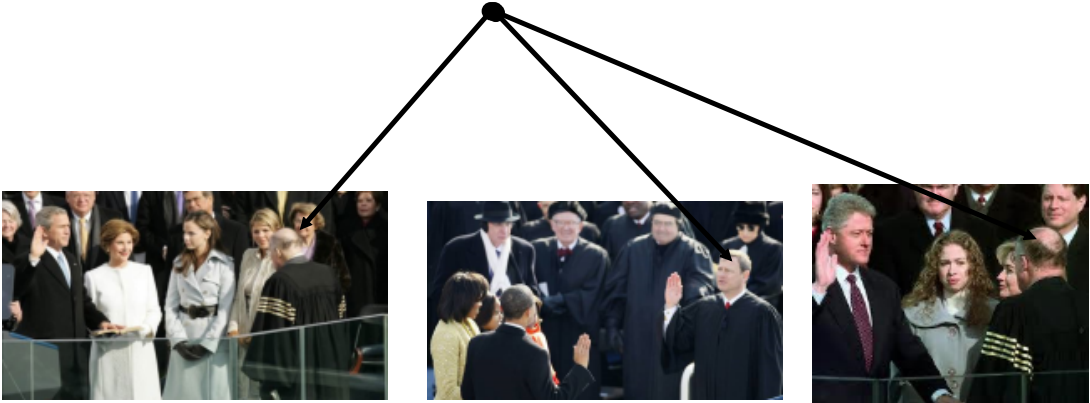
Pres, VP, Speaker of the House, President Pro Tempore of Senate, Sec. of State

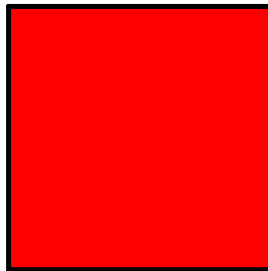

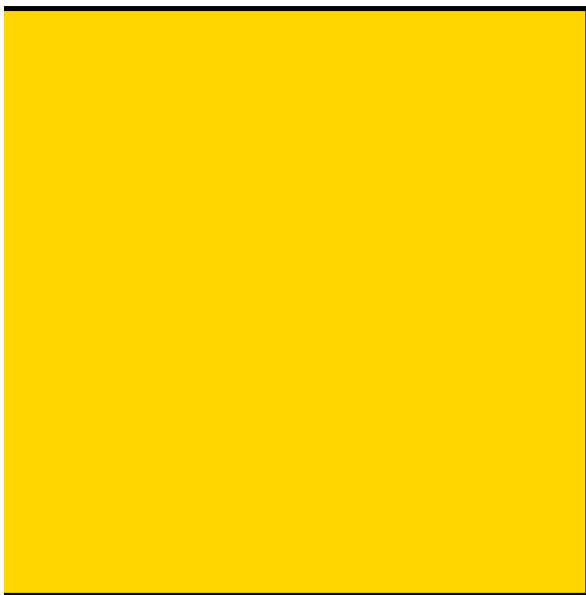

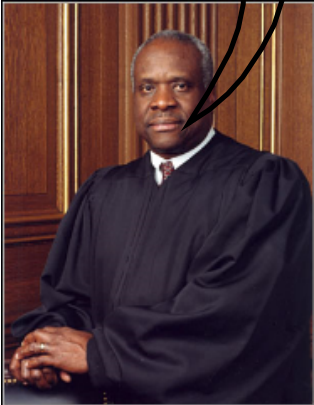
